Word/Phrase	Meaning	Example Sentence
What are you doing...?	Ask about someone's schedule	What are you doing this weekend?
Do you want to...?	Invite someone to do something	Do you want to go to the movies?
Let's...	Suggest an activity	Let's meet at the college.
Sounds good	Agree with a plan	Friday night? Sounds good!
I'm free / I'm busy	Talk about availability	I'm free on Saturday.
Maybe another time	Politely decline	I'm busy today—maybe another time.

Word/Phrase	Meaning	Example Sentence
What time?	Ask about time	What time should we meet?
Where should we meet?	Ask about location	Where should we meet?
See you then!	Confirm the plan	Okay, see you then!
Can't wait!	Show excitement	Movie night? Can't wait!

Frequently Asked Questions

Q1: How do I invite a friend to do something?

A1: Use “Do you want to...?” For example: “Do you want to go to the movies?”

Q2: How do I agree with a plan?

A2: Say “Sounds good!” or “See you then!”

Q3: How do I politely decline an invitation?

A3: Say “I’m busy today—maybe another time.”

How to Make Plans with Friends in 3 Steps

1. Ask: “What are you doing this weekend?”
2. Suggest: “Let’s meet at the park.”
3. Confirm: “Okay, see you then!”

Word/Phrase	Meaning	Example Sentence
House / Apartment	Types of homes	I live in an apartment.
Room	A space in a home	My favorite room is the living room.

Word/Phrase	Meaning	Example Sentence
Kitchen	Where you cook food	The kitchen is next to the dining room.
Bedroom	Where you sleep	My bedroom is small but cozy.
Bathroom	Where you wash	The bathroom is clean and bright.
Living room	Where you relax	We watch TV in the living room.
Furniture	Items like chairs, tables, beds	There's a sofa and a coffee table.
Window / Door	Openings in a room	The window is big and sunny.
Garden / Yard	Outdoor space	We have a small garden with flowers.
Upstairs / Downstairs	Levels of a home	The bedrooms are upstairs.

Word/Phrase	Meaning	Example Sentence
I don't feel well	Express illness	I don't feel well today.
I have a headache	Describe a symptom	I have a headache.
I need to see a doctor	Request medical help	I need to see a doctor.
How long have you...?	Ask about duration of illness	How long have you had this pain?
Take medicine	Instruction for treatment	Take this medicine twice a day.
Get better	Wish recovery	I hope you get better soon.

Frequently Asked Questions

Q1: How do I say I feel sick?

A1: Say "I don't feel well."

Q2: How do I describe a symptom?

A2: Use "I have ____." For example: "I have a headache."

Q3: How do I ask about illness duration?

A3: Say "How long have you had this pain?"

How to Talk at the Doctor's Office in 3 Steps

1. Explain: "I don't feel well."
2. Describe: "I have a headache."
3. Request: "I need to see a doctor."

Class	A subject or lesson	I have math class today.

Word/Phrase	Meaning	Example Sentence
Teacher	Person who teaches	My teacher is very kind.
Homework	Work assigned to students	I need to finish my homework.
Exam	Test of knowledge	We have an exam tomorrow.
Study	Practice learning	I study English every evening.
Break	Rest period	Let's take a break.

Boss	Manager or supervisor	My boss is strict but fair.

Passport	Official travel document	Don’t forget your passport.
Luggage	Bags or suitcases for travel	My luggage is heavy.
Flight	Scheduled air travel	My flight is at 6 p.m.
Hotel	Place to stay when traveling	We booked a hotel near the beach.
Reservation	Booking in advance	I have a reservation.
