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### 1. English Vocabulary for Beginners: Describing People – Appearance and Personality

You can describe people in many ways. The table below shows an appearance and personality vocabulary list for describing family and friends.

## Appearance Vocabulary

Word/Phrase	Meaning	Example Sentence
Tall / Short	Height	She's tall and athletic.
Slim / Chubby	Body shape	He's a bit chubby but very cheerful.
Blonde / Brunette	Hair color	She's a brunette with curly hair.
Curly / Straight	Hair texture	I have straight hair.
Beard / Mustache	Facial hair	He has a thick beard.
Glasses	Eye wear	He wears glasses.

## Personality Vocabulary

Word/Phrase	Meaning	Example Sentence
Friendly	Kind and sociable	She's very friendly and easy to talk to.
Shy	Quiet and reserved	He's shy around new people.
Funny	Makes people laugh	My uncle is really funny.
Hardworking	Works with effort	She's a hardworking student.
Honest	Tells the truth	I trust him—he's honest.
Creative	Full of ideas	She's creative and loves painting.

**Q1: How can I describe someone's appearance in English?**

A1: Use adjectives like tall, short, slim, chubby, curly, straight, or glasses to describe physical traits

**Q2: How do I describe personality naturally?**

A2: Use words like friendly, shy, funny, hardworking, honest, or creative to show character

**Q3: Why combine appearance and personality?**

A3: Alt gives a fuller description and makes conversations more engaging.

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**How to Describe Appearance, Personality and Practice Describing People**

**1. To describe appearance**

- Start with height or body shape.
- Add hair color/texture.
- Mention accessories (glasses, beard).

**2. To describe personality**

- Use positive adjectives.
- Give examples: “She’s hardworking, always studies late.”
- Keep it simple.

**3. To practice describing people**

- Use photos of friends/family.
- Write short sentences.
- Speak them aloud for fluency.

**2. Everyday English for Life Lessons: Giving Directions in Town**

Learn how to ask for directions, understand location phrases, and guide someone using clear, simple English vocabulary for transportation.

**Directions Vocabulary**

Phrase	Use	Example Sentence
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Where is the...?      Ask for location    Where is the nearest bank?

How do I get to...?      Ask for directions    How do I get to the train station?

Go straight / Turn left/right    Give directions      Go straight and turn left at the corner.

It's on the left/right      Describe location    The pharmacy is on the right.

Next to / Across from      Relative position    The restaurant is next to the bookstore.

At the corner / Intersection    Specific location    It's at the corner of Main Street.

Traffic light / Roundabout    Landmarks          Turn right at the traffic light.

Block / Street / Avenue      Units of distance    Walk two blocks and turn left.

Listen	Pay attention to sounds	I listen to music every evening.
Watch	Look at something	We watch movies on weekends.
Play	Perform or use an instrument	He plays the guitar.
Favorite	Most liked	My favorite movie is a comedy.

## Frequently Asked Questions

### Q1: How do I talk about music in English?

A1: Use “listen to” for music and “song” for specific pieces.

### Q2: What’s the difference between ‘watch’ and ‘listen’?

A2: “Watch” is for movies or shows, “listen” is for music or sounds.

### Q3: Why practice entertainment vocabulary?

A3: It helps you share interests and connect socially.

## How to Describe Your Music, Talk About Movies and Practice Entertainment Vocabulary

### 1. To describe your music taste

- Use “I like [genre] music.”
- Mention favorite artists.
- Add when you listen.

### 2. To talk about movies

- Use “My favorite movie is...”
- Add genre or reason.
- Share opinions.

### 3. To practice entertainment vocabulary

- Write sentences about songs/movies.
  - Role-play conversations.
  - Share with classmates.

Upstairs	On a higher floor	The bathroom is upstairs.
Downstairs	On a lower floor	The kitchen is downstairs.
Left	Direction	Turn left at the corridor.
Right	Direction	The office is on the right.
Corridor	Passage inside a building	Walk down the corridor.
Room	Space in a building	The meeting room is next door.
Office	Workplace room	My office is upstairs.
Bathroom	Washroom	The bathroom is on the left.
Kitchen	Cooking area	The kitchen is downstairs.
Door	Entrance/exit	Close the door, please.

## Sample Conversation

A: Where is the kitchen?

B: It's downstairs, next to the living room.

A: And the bathroom?

B: It's upstairs, on the left.

### 1. To ask for directions indoors

### Q1: How do I describe a holiday in English?

A1: Use past tense verbs: "I traveled," "I visited," "I stayed."

A2: Words like country, city, airport, hotel, sightseeing, tourist, museum, beach, mountain

### Q3: Why use past tense for holidays?

A3: Because holidays are completed events, past tense makes them clear.

- Mention feelings.

### 2. To ask about holidays

- Share with classmates.
- Use photos for inspiration.
