- Add duties: “My job involves...”
- Mention routine.

2. To describe your studies

- Use “I’m a student at...”
- Add subject.
- Mention daily habits.

3. To talk about future goals

- Use “In the future, I’d like to...”
- Add career or study plans.
- Keep it positive.
